SCHOOL HOURS & SCHEDULING MODEL

NINTH GRADE COURSES:

All ninth graders will take the following courses:

- ▶ Pre IB English 1 (1 Credit)
- ► AP U.S. History/Honors U.S. History (I Credit)
- ▶ Pre-IB French I, Pre-IB German I, or Pre IB Spanish (1)
 Credit)
- ► Pre-IB Biology 1 (1 Credit)
- Math (depends on your starting position): Algebra 1 → Geometry → Algebra 2 → Remaining Math Options

All Courses in the 9-12 IB Progression are required to be taken on campus with HCHS/HCIB Staff.



NINTH GRADE COURSES CONTINUED:

- Group 6 Elective Options:
 - Visual Arts Pre-IB Art 1
 - Psychology Psychology 1/Psychology 2
 - Music Pre-IB Music (Band, Chorus, Orchestra)
 - Theatre Acting 1
 - Global Politics-AP U.S. History* U.S. History Honors
 - Philosophy AP U.S. History*

*AP U.S. History is already included in the 9th grade curriculum so these two options (History of the Americas and Philosophy) provide the opportunity to take an additional general elective.

- General Electives: See the attached sheet
 - You have 1 or 2 choices depending on which Group 6 Elective you select.





- ► Community Service is an integral part of the IB Program.
 - ▶ Ninth grade students are required to submit 1 high quality reflections by the last day of school before Winter Break, Friday December 21st to Ms. Maggs. The second high quality reflection is due to Ms. Maggs April 5th.
 - ► Students must produce a minimum 4 high quality reflections throughout both 9th and 10th grade. These are mandatory and must be submitted on time to remain in the program.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

- ► For students participating in extra-curricular activities:
 - ▶Band, JROTC, Sports, Chess, etc., may use these experiences as part of their community service.
 - ▶ Reflections and Hours:
 - ► There are two things students need to do to keep track of their community service.
 - ▶ 1. Record the activities and the time spent working on those activities.
 - ▶ 2. Produce a reflection of the project or activity as a whole. Some of the questions you might want to answer will be: What did I expect?, What did I learn or gain?, How did I help make a difference?, How did this change me?

PARENTS: WHAT TO EXPECT
